Since that day, our Humane Law Enforcement Officers have been dedicated to protecting all animals and making sure that they are treated with the respect they deserve. We have officers working seven days a week to help animals that are abused, lost or needing emergency assistance. Our Humane Law Enforcement team also responds to disasters, to help animals get to safety, like the recent wildfires and floods in the Southeast.

Our officers go through training to learn how to help not only pets, but wildlife as well. If you ever come across a wild animal that you think is in need

of help, always get an adult first and never touch the animal with your bare hands. Then, if you are not able to safely bring the animal to Project Wildlife, you can call San Diego Humane Society to send an officer to help. Our Humane Law Enforcement officers recently rescued this adorable little bat who was stuck in someone's garage!
